1. Nomination and Application Process

NOMINATION (Undergraduate and Graduate)	Students must be nominated by their home institution through the Ontario Tech Inbound Student Exchange Nomination Form. Home institutions must have a valid student exchange agreement with Ontario Tech University. Note: Ontario Tech respects the minimum GPA requirement the host institution determines in their internal processes to nominate students. Approval for exchange is subject to faculty approval and course availability.	Deadlines Summer term: February 15 Fall term: March 15 Winter term: September 15*
APPLICATION	After a student is nominated by their home institution and approved to proceed, the nominated student must: 1. Complete the online exchange application and upload their supporting documentation: Copy of valid passport: Valid for at least 6 months after the expected return date Transcript: Undergraduate students are required to provide their current university transcripts. Recommendation letter: Must be sent from the home university. including confirmation of English language skills. 2. Complete the International Student Exchange Inbound Application Form (Proposed Courses)	Deadlines Summer term: March 15 Fall term: April 15 Winter term: October 15*

Late applications may be reviewed on a case by case basis. We recommend Winter nominations and applications to be submitted at the Fall deadlines.

2. Academics

Ontario Tech accepts applications from both undergraduate and graduate exchange students. Exchange students must be registered full time at their home university. They are permitted to take courses across faculties provided they meet the pre-requisite qualifications and have permission from both their home institution and host faculty at Ontario Tech.

English Language Requirements

The language of instruction at Ontario Tech is English. All incoming exchange students must have sufficient <u>undergraduate</u> and <u>graduate</u> English language proficiency to be successful in their level of study.

Graduate study

Students who wish to apply to the graduate level must have completed four years of university or equivalent in their area of study.

Courses at Ontario Tech

Students can take a maximum of five courses per term. To be considered full-time as an undergraduate student, students must be enrolled in a minimum of three courses.

Students are required to <u>choose their courses</u> when they submit their application. They will be asked to provide their top and secondary course choices when they submit their application. We will work to register students in their top choices, however, there is no guarantee that courses will be available.

As a guide, where applicable, 3 credits = 1 course = 6 ECTS.

Grading system

Incoming exchange students should familiarize themselves with the university grading system for <u>Undergraduate students</u> or <u>Graduate students</u>.

Transcript

At the end of the exchange, once grade are released, students can <u>request their official</u> <u>transcript</u> online through their <u>MyOntarioTech</u> account. Transcript requests can usually take five business days to process and may take longer during peak times.

3. Financial Information

Fees

Exchange students are responsible for two fees while studying at Ontario Tech: <u>UHIP and U-Pass fees</u> can be paid before or upon arrival through various <u>payment options.</u>

Estimated \$224/term (subject to change) The University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) is a mandatory health insurance plan that provides coverage for basic medical services and treatments. Coverage information can be found on the UHIP website.	Estimated \$147.25/term (subject to change) All full-time students at Ontario Tech receive a Universal Transit Pass (U-Pass), which provides them with unlimited access to Durham Region Transit during the academic year.

Estimated Cost of Living

Please be advised that the following table provides estimated costs in Canadian dollars. Costs are subject to change and the information is provided for guidance only. Students are advised to research carefully when planning their finances. We recommend budgeting beyond our estimates to ensure sufficient funds to cover all expenses.

4. Housing/Accommodations

Students decide where they want to live. Their options include on-campus housing, renting a property off-campus or living in a homestay.

There is no limit to the number of rooms available to exchange students. However, students are advised to apply early as it is a first come first serve basis. Applications are made directly to the residence. Visit our residence website for more information.	Students are welcome to opt for off-campus living and can use property listing for students to find rental accommodations available around Oshawa. We advise that students contact the landlord directly for information.	Students can also opt to live with a host family in their home. Ontario Tech's Homestay Program is operated by the Canada Homestay Network (CHN). These host families (and their homes) have gone through an application and screening process to make sure they are suitable for hosting Ontario Tech students.

5. Student Services

Orientation

All exchange students must attend both the <u>Ridgeback Orientation</u> and the <u>International Orientation</u>. You may also register for other optional orientation programs such as the <u>MyStart</u>, a series of faculty-specific online modules and live workshops or the <u>Graduate Orientation</u>, if applicable. Register for each orientation program you will attend.
