Summary of New Member Applicants 2025

Background:

By the membership application deadline in February 2025, the UArctic International Secretariat received 22 membership applications, including 14 Arctic member and eight Non-Arctic member applications. One application was deferred to next year.

Following an extensive review, the UArctic Membership Committee nominated the following eight applicants to the category of Non-Arctic Member of UArctic; of which one is Higher Education Institutions and seven are Other Institutions.

Rationale:

UArctic Bylaws, section 2.1 – UArctic Membership:

UArctic has two membership categories:

- 1. Arctic Members
- 2. Non-Arctic Members

Within each membership category, there are two member types:

- i. Higher Education Institutions
- ii. Other Organizations

Acting on new applications for UArctic membership, the Assembly of UArctic decides on the category and type for each new member, based on recommendations from UArctic's Membership Committee - -.
