



north2north is the mobility program of the University of the Arctic (UArctic). UArctic is an association of universities, colleges, research institutes and other organizations concerned with education and research in and about the North.

The principles of the north2north mobility program are rooted in UArctic's strategic plan, mission and guidelines, aiming at increasing the student, staff and researcher mobility among seven Arctic member countries (USA, Canada, Kingdom of Denmark including Greenland and the Faroe Islands, Iceland, Finland, Norway and Sweden) and non-Arctic countries (France and Scotland).
